

Global Engineering Management & Support wins \$1M in transportation, defense contracts

A government-sponsored high tech agency in [Melbourne](#) said this week that one of the companies located in its business incubator has landed a series of key contracts from the federal government.

Global Engineering Management & Support Inc. has received contracts worth more than \$1 million for defense and public mass transit work, according to the Technological Research & Development Authority, which operates the TRDA Business Innovation Center.

Global Engineering designs and produces automated test systems for military, space and commercial equipment. The company's products have been used in more than 20 military programs and 70 satellite launches, according to the high-tech agency.

The TRDA business incubator was established more than two decades ago to support emerging high-tech businesses. It provides newer companies with central office space, shared business services, investor networking and mentoring support, among other services.

The agency has stepped up its work with entrepreneurs in Central Florida this year, with thousands of space industry workers facing potential job loss as the shuttle program is being phased out.
